Students who are able to obtain N1 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) during their exchange period and have sufficient specialized knowledge can take courses in the department in the latter semester of their exchange period.

3. Note for those who wish to take specialized courses

•Changes to the course of department that have been confirmed prior to arrival in Japan will not be permitted during the exchange period (Except in cases where JLPT N1 is obtained).

•Tuition fees will be determined according to the applicable year of enrollment at the university.

•Exchange students may take courses regardless of the year in which they are offered (however, they must fulfill course requirements).

•The maximum number of credits for specialized courses is limited to 20 credits per half year.

4. Number of students accepted, duration, tuition, accommodation

Accommodation :

•International dormitories or private student dormitories will be introduced to those who would like to request.

•Due to the number of rooms in the international dormitories, not all applicants may be able to move in.

•The standard monthly rent for private student dormitories is around 80,000 yen, and a total of 150,000 yen is required when moving in and out of other dormitories.

•Since exchange students are non-regular students, they cannot purchase a commuter pass with a student discount due to the regulations of JR and other transportation companies.

*The cost of a regular commuter pass from the International Dormitory to the campus is approximately 20,000 yen per month (varies depending on the route).

Others :

 \cdot We accept applicants who have a strong desire to study at Musashino University and are interested in international exchange with Japanese students.

•After the acceptance of the program is fixed, the date of arrival in Japan will be designated by the University

•Postgraduate students are not eligible for undergraduate level courses at the University.

•Students must remain enrolled at their home university throughout the duration of their studies at the University. (Second and Third year undergraduates are preferred.)

•If students wish to extend their study abroad period (from six months to one year), the students must submit their request by the end of October 2024. Applications submitted after that date will not be accepted.

•Students will be responsible for all flight cancellation and change fees incurred due to delays in the issuance of your Certificate of Eligibility or other schedule changes related to their visit to Japan.
